Flag Contracts are one year beginning February 1 through January 31 of following year and include the use of the American Flag, Flag Pole and Holder. The VFW will clean and replace Flags as necessary, ensure all Flags are suitable for public display and handle any required public authorizations.

Contracts and Full Payment are due by 1 February each year. Unpaid contracts will result in the removal of all Flags and hardware by the VFW.

On-Premise Flags remain at your business to display at your discretion.

Posted Flags will be supplied and posted by the VFW at your business on the below occasions and stored by the VFW.

VFW Posted Flags will be provided on the following occasions:

Martin Luther King Jr. BD – 3rd Monday in January Presidents' Day – 3rd Monday in February

Armed Forces Day – 3rd Saturday in May Memorial Day – Last Monday in May

Flag Day – June 14 Independence Day – July 4th

Labor Day – 1st Monday in September Patriot Day – September 11th

Cranberry Festival Parade Day – September POW/MIA Day – 3rd Friday in September

Columbus Day – 2nd Monday in October Veterans Day – November 11th

Pearl Harbor Day – December 7th

USE AND CARE OF THE UNITED STATE FLAG

The first requirement for flying the American Flag is that it be flown with respect. Fly it only in good weather from sunrise to sunset and at full staff. If displayed at night, it should be lit. Fly the Flag at half-staff according to official decrees and until noon on Memorial Day. Flags fixed to a pole should have two black ribbons about the length from top to bottom stripes affixed to the pole

Never let the Flag touch anything beneath it such as the ground, floor, water or merchandise. When flown with other Flags, it should appear prominently above them. Never display the Flag with the union down except as a signal of extreme distress or danger. The Flag should never be festooned, drawn back, nor up in folds, but always allowed to fall free.

Flags should be stored folded or rolled neatly and kept clean and dry.

The VFW will replace or properly dispose of the old Flag if it becomes dirty, worn or tattered.
